Zone-tailed Hawk	<i>Buteo albonotatus</i>
1 close going to Barfoot Park and 3 juveniles begging at Patagonia-Sonita Creek Reserve	
Red-tailed Hawk	<i>Buteo jamaicensis</i>
Common in small numbers, seen on most days	
Golden Eagle	<i>Aquila chrysaetos</i>
1 at the Grand Canyon; 2 flying along the ridge at Madera Canyon and 1 close by at California Gulch	
American Kestrel	<i>Falco sparverius</i>
Small numbers in the prairies around the San Francisco Peaks and grasslands at Huachuca; singles at Aravaipa and California Gulch	
Peregrine Falcon	<i>Falco peregrinus</i>
1 pursuing a bird in Garden Canyon	
Wild Turkey	<i>Meleagris gallopavo</i>
1 along the farms in Aravaipa Canyon	
Scaled Quail	<i>Callipepla squamata</i>
Several dozen in residential areas around Hereford	
Gambel's Quail	<i>Callipepla gambelii</i>
Small numbers in Aravaipa and on the road to Paradise, including 1 splendid male perched on a post along the roadside	
Montezuma Quail	<i>Cyrtonyx montezumae</i>
Several calling in Florida Wash; a pair crossing the track to California Gulch; 3 alongside the road to California Gulch and 1 at a feeder near South Fork. Great looks / success / luck considering this is a tough species to locate.

Ruddy Ground-Dove	<i>Columbina talpacoti</i>
A male and female at Red Rocks Cattle Pens - a few are usually found in Arizona having come up from Mexico

1 at Patagonia and 1 in California Gulch, first located by call	
Greater Roadrunner	<i>Geococcyx californianus</i>
1 taking an afternoon rest in the shade at the Pecan Grove; 1 between Bisbee and Portal; 1 in Hereford; several in Tucson; 1 in California Gulch and 1 at Avaivapa Canyon

1 crossing the road between Green Valley and Florida Wash	
Western Screech-Owl	<i>Otus kennicottii</i>
1 calling in Madera Canyon and 1 alighting briefly on a branch near Portal	
Whiskered Screech-Owl	<i>Otus trichopsis</i>
1 calling in Madera Canyon	
Great Horned Owl	<i>Bubo virginianus</i>
1 perched on a telegraph pole at Florida Was and Portal and 1 calling before dawn in California Gulch	
Northern Pygmy-Owl	<i>Glaucidium gnoma</i>
1 calling mid afternoon on the way to Barfoot Park	
Elf Owl	<i>Micrathene whitneyi</i>
1 shot out of the back of a telegraph pole at Santa Rita Lodge in Madera Canyon, leaving everyone dissatisfied! 1 called a couple of times in Portal	
Spotted Owl	<i>Strix occidentalis</i>
On 2 occasions in Scheelite Canyon, an adult and a young and on the second visit a adult and 2 young on the same branch with the other parent about 80 yards away. This being the 'Mexican' race.

Several in Tucson and California Gulch; about a dozen in Florida Wash and a couple in Portal

Seen at Ash Canyon B&B, Beatty B&B, Madera Canyon and Aravaipa	
White-eared Hummingbird	<i>Hylocharis leucotis</i>
1 male at Beatty's B&B

1 at Ash Canyon B&B
