**Day 11:** PAX Guest House - verandah, Old Donkey Trail and Alben Ride (the Tower Trail); PAX to the Port of Spain Airport

<b>Red-footed Booby</b>	Several small family groups on Little Tobago - 4/1
<b>Brown Pelican</b>	8 at Blanchisseuse; singles at Manzanilla Beach and Blue Waters; 10 around Little Tobago; 6 at Waterloo - 8/6
<b>Neotropic Cormorant</b>	2 at Point-a-Pierre WT and 2 at Waterloo - 2/1
<b>Anhinga</b>	Common at Bon Accord; 3 at Point-a-Pierre - 6/2
<b>Magnificent Frigatebird</b>	Common around the coasts - 21/7
<b>Pinnated Bittern</b>	1 seen well at Nariva Swamp on the Kernashaw Trail - 1/1
<b>Great Blue Heron</b>	1 on the edge of the mudflats at Waterloo - 1/1
<b>White-necked "Cocoi" Heron</b>	Individuals at Aripo Livestock Farm and Caroni Swamp - 1/3
<b>Great Egret</b>	Common at Nariva Swamp and Caroni Swamp; 6 at Bon Accord - 9/3
<b>Snowy Egret</b>	1 at Bon Accord; Common at Caroni Swamp - 17/2
<b>Little Blue Heron</b>	Large numbers at Caroni Swamp; singles at Blue Waters and Bon Accord - 24/3
<b>Tricolored Heron</b>	Common at Caroni Swamp - 7/1
<b>Cattle Egret</b>	Abundant in the lowlands - seen on 8 of the 11 days
<b>Green Heron</b>	13 at Bon Accord, including 1 "Tobago" Green Heron; individuals at Blue Waters and Point-a-Pierre - 9/4
<b>Striated Heron</b>	6 at Nariva Swamp and 1 at Point-a-Pierre - 4/2
<b>Black-crowned Night-Heron</b>	2 juv's at Bon Accord; 1 at Point-a-Pierre and 1 at Waterloo - 1/2
<b>Yellow-crowned Night-Heron</b>	1 adult, 1 juv at Bon Accord; 2 on Little Tobago and 4 at Caroni - 2/3
<b>Scarlet Ibis</b>	21 juvs in flight at Nariva; 2-3000 coming to roost at Caroni - 500+/2
<b>Black Vulture</b>	Abundant - seen on 8 of 11 days
<b>Turkey Vulture</b>	Abundant - seen on 9 of 11 days
<b>Black-bellied Whistling-Duck</b>	22 at Bon Accord; common at Point-a-Pierre - 50/2
<b>Fulvous Whistling-Duck</b>	1 (wild?) at Point-a-Pierre - 1/1

<b>Blue-winged Teal</b>	27 at Caroni Swamp - 21/1
<b>White-cheeked Pintail</b>	7 at Bon Accord and 3 at Point-a-Pierre - 5/2
<b>Osprey</b>	Up to 4 at Blue Waters; several at Waterloo and small numbers at Caroni Swamp - 4/4
<b>Grey-headed Kite</b>	1 on the Main Ridge (KK); 1 on the road to Mt. St. Benedict - 1/2
<b>Hook-billed Kite</b>	1 over the hill behind Blue Waters (AB) - 1/1
<b>Swallow-tailed Kite</b>	1 near the Nariva Swamp Sign - 1/1
<b>Pearl Kite</b>	1 on the way to ASA; 1 perched and hunting at Manzanilla - 1/2
<b>Double-toothed Kite</b>	1 seen at ASA Wright (BMcG & EP) - 1/1
<b>Plumbeous Kite</b>	3 flying over the North Range; 1 perched near the Nariva Swamp sign - 2/2
<b>White Hawk</b>	1 over ASA; 4 on the North Range; 1 at Aripo Livestock Farm and 3 from the PAX verandah - 2/6
<b>Grey Hawk</b>	An adult and a juv at the Nariva Swamp Sign; a juv at the Moriche Palm site at Waller Field - 1/2
<b>Common Black Hawk</b>	12 on the North Range, including 4 together; individuals at Aripo Livestock Farm and Blue Waters; 3 at PAX - 4/6
<b>Great Black Hawk</b>	1 juv (basic1) at Blue Waters - 1/1
<b>Savannah Hawk</b>	Small numbers at Aripo Livestock Farm and Nariva Swamp; singles at Moriche Palm site at Waller Field and Caroni Rice Fields - 3/3
<b>Broad-winged Hawk</b>	A kettle of 50+ at Bon Accord; 2 on the Main Ridge and 2 at Bloody Bay Overlook - 50/3
<b>Short-tailed Hawk</b>	Individuals on the way to ASA, over ASA and the North Range all light morphs - 1/3
<b>Zone-tailed Hawk</b>	Individuals on the North Range (AB), on the way to the Caroni Rice Field and on the road to Mt. St. Benedict - 1/3
<b>Ornate Hawk-Eagle</b>	1 at a nest just off the Discovery Trail at ASA and one in flight on the North Range - 1/2
<b>Yellow-headed Caracara</b>	Singles at Aripo Livestock Farm, Waller Field and Caroni Rice Fields; 2 around Nariva Swamp - 1/3
<b>Merlin</b>	Singles at Aripo Livestock Farm and Blue Waters - 1/3
<b>Aplomado Falcon</b>	1 along the coast north of Nariva Swamp (KK) - 1/1
<b>Peregrine Falcon</b>	2 on the way to ASA in Arima - 2/1
<b>Sharp-shinned Hawk</b>	1 of the race <i>venator</i> at PAX (KK) - 1/1
<b>Rufous-vented Chachalaca</b>	Common at Blue Waters and the Main Ridge - 9/3
<b>Rufous-necked Wood-Rail</b>	1 flew across the bow of the boat at Caroni Swamp - 1/1
<b>Purple Gallinule</b>	1 at Point-a-Pierre - 1/1
<b>Common Moorhen</b>	2 at Bon Accord; 2 at Point-a-Pierre - 2/2
<b>Limpkin</b>	Heard at Bon Accord (KK) - 1/1
<b>Southern Lapwing</b>	4 in Arima; 12 at Nariva Swamp; 8 at Waller Field; 12 at Bon Accord and 20+ Point-a-Pierre - 10/5
<b>Black-bellied Plover</b>	6 at Waterloo - 3/1
<b>Semipalmated Plover</b>	Common at Waterloo; several at Caroni Swamp - 14/1
<b>Wattled Jacana</b>	1 at Aripo Livestock Farm; 8 at Nariva Swamp; 6 at Bon Accord and 4 in the Caroni Rice Fields - 6/3
<b>Greater Yellowlegs</b>	6 at Waterloo - 4/1
<b>Solitary Sandpiper</b>	1 put in a brief appearance at Waterloo (KK) - 1/1
<b>Willet</b>	12 at Waterloo and 3 at Caroni Swamp, all of the western race - 8/1
<b>Spotted Sandpiper</b>	Common at Waterloo and Caroni Swamp; 2 at Nariva Swamp; 2 at Blue Waters - 3/5
<b>Whimbrel</b>	5 at Waterloo - 4/1
<b>Ruddy Turnstone</b>	25 at Blue Waters and 10 at Waterloo - 25/4
<b>Red Knot</b>	20+ at Waterloo - 20/1
<b>Semipalmated Sandpiper</b>	6 at Waterloo - 4/1
<b>Western Sandpiper</b>	Common at Waterloo - 60/1
<b>Short-billed Dowitcher</b>	30+ at Waterloo - 30/1
<b>Laughing Gull</b>	2 at Bon Accord; 200+ seen from the plane while leaving Tobago and common at Waterloo - 200/3
<b>Large-billed Tern</b>	20+ at Waterloo - 20/1

<b>Black Skimmer</b>	Common at Waterloo - 11/1
<b>Rock Dove</b>	What would a trip be without pigeons! - Common on all but 2 days
<b>Pale-vented Pigeon</b>	2 at Waller Field; Small numbers at Blue Waters and on wires in Tobago- 3/4
<b>Eared Dove</b>	Common on Tobago; Caroni Rice Fields and 2 on road to Mt. St. Benedict - 5/5
<b>Scaled Dove</b>	3 seen over the North Range; individuals at ASA Wright - 3/4
<b>Ruddy Ground-Dove</b>	Abundant - seen on all but 2 days
<b>White-tipped Dove</b>	1 or 2 at ASA Wright and PAX; more common on Tobago - 3/7
<b>Gray-fronted Dove</b>	Small numbers at ASA Wright - 3/5
<b>Ruddy Quail-Dove</b>	1 female seen by several participants at ASA on the Manakin Trail
<b>Red-bellied Macaw</b>	50+ coming in to roost in the Palms at Nariva Swamp - 50/1
<b>Green-rumped Parrotlet</b>	A dozen at Aripo Livestock Farm; 6 at Bon Accord at 2 on the road to Mt. St. Benedict - 6/3
<b>Blue-headed Parrot</b>	3 on the North Range - 2/1
<b>Yellow-crowned Parrot</b>	1 flying over the Kernaham Trail at Nariva Swamp - 1/1
<b>Orange-winged Parrot</b>	Common - seen every day
<b>Squirrel Cuckoo</b>	Individuals at ASA Wright - 1/3
<b>Striped Cuckoo</b>	1 heard at Aripo Livestock Farm and 1 seen at Waller Field - 1/2
<b>Greater Ani</b>	1 seen well on the edge of the mangroves at Caroni Swamp - 1/1
<b>Smooth-billed Ani</b>	Common - seen every day
<b>Tropical Screech-Owl</b>	1 in the eaves of an abandoned building at Waller Field Airstrip - 1/1
<b>Ferruginous Pygmy-Owl</b>	Heard on all but 2 days; 1 seen at ASA Wright - 1/9
<b>Short-tailed Nighthawk</b>	Up to 2 seen flying around the light post at ASA Wright - 2/3
<b>Common Pauraque</b>	Small numbers at Waller Field; Heard daily at PAX - 2/4
<b>White-tailed Nightjar</b>	Very common at Waller Field - 4/1
<b>Common Potoo</b>	2 at Waller Field and 1 at Caroni Swamp - 1/2
<b>Oilbird</b>	1 in flight at first light from the ASA verandah (AB) and 20 at Dunstan (the Oilbird) Cave at ASA - 20/2
<b>Chestnut-collared Swift</b>	2 on the way to ASA Wright (AB) - 2/1
<b>Short-tailed Swift</b>	4 at Blanchesseuse; 2 at Gilpin Trace; 8 at Aripo Livestock Farm; Common at Caroni Rice Fields and around Pax - 12/6
<b>Band-rumped Swift</b>	Common at ASA - 30/4
<b>Gray-rumped Swift</b>	Common at ASA, Gilpin Trace and 3 at PAX - 30/5
<b>Lesser Swallow-tailed Swift</b>	1 seen from the ASA grounds - 1/1
<b>Fork-tailed Palm-Swift</b>	Common at Aripo Livestock Farm and Waller Field - 5/2
<b>Rufous-breasted Hermit</b>	Several at ASA; 7 at Gilpin Trace; 1 on Little Tobago and 1 on the Old Donkey Trail - 2/8
<b>Green Hermit</b>	1 at ASA; 1 on the Old Donkey Trail - 1/3
<b>Little Hermit</b>	1 at ASA - 1/2
<b>White-tailed Sabrewing</b>	1 on the Roxborough-Bloody Bay Road; 4 including a female on a nest at Gilpin Trace
<b>White-necked Jacobin</b>	Very common at ASA Wright; several at Gilpin Trace; 1 at PAX - 4/7
<b>Brown Violet-ear</b>	1 at Waller Field (KK)
<b>Black-throated Mango</b>	Several at ASA; 1 at Grafton Estate and 2 females at PAX - 2/9
<b>Ruby-topaz Hummingbird</b>	1 female briefly seen on the Roxborough-Bloody Bay Road and great looks at a male at Point-a-Pierre Wildfowl Trust - 1/2
<b>Tufted Cocquette</b>	Up to 4 at ASA Wright - 1/5
<b>Blue-chinned Sapphire</b>	1 seen 'zipping through' the Gaucharo Trail at ASA by James - 1/1
<b>White-tailed Goldenthrout</b>	1 seen by Jogie 'zipping by' at Waller Field
<b>White-chested Emerald</b>	Small numbers at ASA Wright and PAX - 3/8
<b>Copper-rumped Hummingbird</b>	Seen daily in small numbers - 4/11
<b>White-tailed Trogon</b>	Heard at ASA and a still debated female on the North Range
<b>Violaceous Trogon</b>	4 at ASA Wright; 6 on the North Range - 5/3
<b>Collared Trogon</b>	Individuals at ASA Wright; North Range and at Speyside; Heard at PAX and at Gilpin Trace - 1/5
<b>Blue-crowned Motmot</b>	Common at ASA Wright and Gilpin Trace; several at Blue Waters and heard at PAX - 5/9

<b>Ringed Kingfisher</b>	A male at Point-a-Pierre Wildfowl Trust - 1/1
<b>Green Kingfisher</b>	A probable Green at the Oilbird Cave; a male at Point-a-Pierre - 1/2
<b>Rufous-tailed Jacamar</b>	1 at ASA; 2 on the North Range; 1 at Waller Field; 2 at Grafton Estate; 3 at Gilpin Trace - 2/5
<b>Channel-billed Toucan</b>	1 perched in the distance before breakfast at ASA Wright - 1/4
<b>Red-crowned Woodpecker</b>	2 at Grafton Estate; 1 on the Main Ridge - 2/2
<b>Red-rumped Woodpecker</b>	2 at ASA Wright - 2/1
<b>Golden-olive Woodpecker</b>	Individuals at ASA Wright - 1/3
<b>Chestnut Woodpecker</b>	Up to 2 at ASA Wright - 1/5
<b>Lineated Woodpecker</b>	Singles at ASA Wright, PAX and Nariva Swamp - 1/5
<b>Stripe-breasted Spinetail</b>	2 on the North Range; 3 on the Guacharo Trail at ASA Wright and 2 at Gilpin Trace - 2/3
<b>Yellow-chinned Spinetail</b>	Several at Aripo Livestock Farm and up to 8 at Nariva Swamp - 3/1
<b>Streaked Xenops</b>	Individuals at ASA Wright; the Old Donkey Trail and on the road to Mt. St. Benedict - 1/3
<b>Gray-throated Leaftosser</b>	1 on the Old Donkey Trail - 1/1
<b>Plain-brown Woodcreeper</b>	2 on the Discovery Trail and 1 on the Guacharo Trail at ASA - 2/4
<b>Olivaceous Woodcreeper</b>	1 heard at Gilpin Trace (KK) - 1/1
<b>Buff-throated Woodcreeper</b>	Several seen at ASA Wright, Gilpin Trace and Grafton Estate, but most often heard everywhere we went - 2/9
<b>Great Antshrike</b>	Several often seen in pairs at ASA and on the Old Donkey Trail - 2/6
<b>Barred Antshrike</b>	Individuals at ASA; Grafton Estate; Point-a-Pierre and Pax - 1/8
<b>Plain Antvireo</b>	1 male on the Manakin Trail at ASA (AB & BMcG) - 1/1
<b>White-flanked Antwren</b>	Up to 6 seen at ASA; 5 on the Old Donkey Trail - 4/3
<b>White-fringed Antwren</b>	Several at Bon Accord, Grafton Estate and Blue Waters - 3/2
<b>Black-faced Antthrush</b>	2 individuals were seen at ASA Wright - 1/2
<b>Southern Beardless-Tyrannulet</b>	Individuals at ASA; North Range; Waller Field and PAX - 1/4
<b>Forest Elaenia</b>	Up to 4 seen at ASA Wright - 2/4
<b>Yellow-bellied Elaenia</b>	1 or 2 seen or heard at most locations, including good numbers at Nariva Swamp - 4/10
<b>Ochre-bellied Flycatcher</b>	Up to 3 seen at ASA; 1 at Gilpin Trace and on Old Donkey Trail - 3/7
<b>Yellow-breasted Flycatcher</b>	2 at Grafton Estate; 1 at Blue Waters and PAX; 6 on the Old Donkey Trail - 2/4
<b>Fuscous Flycatcher</b>	2 at Gilpin Trace - 1/1
<b>Tropical Pewee</b>	1's and 2's at ASA - 1/5
<b>Pied Water-Tyrant</b>	Common at Aripo Livestock Farm and at Nariva Swamp; 1 at Caroni Swamp - 4/2
<b>White-headed Marsh-Tyrant</b>	Small numbers at Aripo Livestock Farm and at Nariva Swamp - 3/1
<b>Brown-crested Flycatcher</b>	2 at PAX and Blue Waters; 4 on the Main Ridge - 2/4
<b>Great Kiskadee</b>	Common to abundant on Trinidad, small numbers on Tobago
<b>Boat-billed Flycatcher</b>	2 at ASA Wright; 1 on the road to Mt. St. Benedict - 2/3
<b>Streaked Flycatcher</b>	Several at ASA Wright; 1 on the Roxborough-Bloody Bay Road and 2 seen from the PAX verandah - 2/4
<b>Piratic Flycatcher</b>	1 at ASA Wright and 2 at PAX - 1/3
<b>Sulphury Flycatcher</b>	3 at the Moriche Palm site at Waller Field Airstrip - 2/1
<b>Tropical Kingbird</b>	Very common - seen daily
<b>Gray Kingbird</b>	3 at Aripo Livestock Farm; 1 at Bon Accord; 2 at Blue Waters - 2/4
<b>Black-tailed Tityra</b>	Singles at ASA Wright and a pair on the Alben Trail at PAX - 2/3
<b>Bearded Bellbird</b>	Heard daily at ASA and 8 seen very well on the Discovery Trail - 4/5
<b>Golden-headed Manakin</b>	3 on the Manakin Trail at ASA; 7 on the North Range; 10 on a lek on the Old Donkey Trail at PAX - 10/3
<b>Blue-backed Manakin</b>	2 at Grafton Estate and 5 at Gilpin Trace - 2/2
<b>White-bearded Manakin</b>	Up to 12 on a lek on the Manakin Trail at ASA Wright - 12/4
<b>Chivi Vireo</b>	Individuals at ASA; 2 at Grafton Estate; heard on the Main Ridge and great views at head height of 2 on Little Tobago - 1/5
<b>Scrub Greenlet</b>	10+ at Bon Accord; 1 at Blue Waters and 1 on the Main Ridge - 6/3
<b>Golden-fronted Greenlet</b>	Heard at PAX; small numbers at ASA and on the North Range - 3/4
<b>Rufous-browed Peppershrike</b>	Several seen and numerous heard at ASA Wright and PAX; 1 seen on the Northern Range - 1/6

<b>White-winged Swallow</b>	1 at Blanchisseuse and Waterloo; 2 at Aripo Livestock Farm - 2/3
<b>Caribbean Martin</b>	2 at Manzanilla Beach (Trinidad); Common on Tobago - 25/4
<b>Gray-breasted Martin</b>	Common at Sangre Grande and Manzanilla Beach - 30/1
<b>South. Rough-winged Swallow</b>	Several on the way to ASA, on the North Range and Aripo Livestock; 2 at the Blanchisseuse lagoon and up to 8 at PAX - 6/5
<b>Barn Swallow</b>	1 group of about 80 at Port of Spain Airport - 80/1
<b>Rufous-breasted Wren</b>	Several at ASA; Common at Gilpin Trace and 4 at PAX on the Old Donkey Trail - 2/7
<b>Southern House Wren</b>	Several seen on all but one day - 2/10
<b>Long-billed Gnatwren</b>	2 on the Guacharo Trail at ASA; 1 on the Old Donkey Trail - 2/3
<b>Yellow-legged Thrush</b>	Up to 12 at Gilpin Trace; 4 at Bloody Bay Overlook - 4/1
<b>Cocoa Thrush</b>	Common at ASA, seen every day on Trinidad - 4/8
<b>Bare-eyed Robin</b>	Seen daily in small numbers; most common on Little Tobago - 5/11
<b>White-necked Thrush</b>	Small numbers at ASA Wright and 2 at Gilpin Trace - 2/4
<b>Tropical Mockingbird</b>	Common to abundant- seen daily
<b>Tropical Parula</b>	1 heard at the Bearded Bellbird site on the Discovery Trail at ASA
<b>Yellow Warbler</b>	1 heard at ASA; 1 at Grafton Estate and Caroni Swamp and several at PAX - 2/5
<b>American Redstart</b>	1 male at Gilpin Trace - 1/1
<b>Northern Waterthrush</b>	Up to 2 at ASA Wright, Blue Waters and Caroni Swamp - 1/5
<b>Golden-crowned Warbler</b>	2 on the Discovery Trail at ASA and 5 on the Old Donkey Trail - 3/2
<b>Bananaquit</b>	Abundant with a capital A. Seen everywhere! - 20/11
<b>White-shouldered Tanager</b>	Up to 4 at ASA and 1 on the Old Donkey Trail at PAX - 2/3
<b>White-lined Tanager</b>	Common - seen daily
<b>Red-crowned Ant-Tanager</b>	1 female on the Guacharo Trail at ASA Wright - 1/1
<b>Hepatic Tanager</b>	1 female at ASA Wright - 1/1
<b>Summer Tanager</b>	1 female at ASA Wright feeders and a male on the road to Mt. St. Benedict at PAX - 1/2
<b>Blue-gray Tanager</b>	Common to abundant - seen daily
<b>Palm Tanager</b>	Common to abundant - seen daily
<b>Silver-beaked Tanager</b>	Up to 15 seen at ASA Wright and 4 at PAX - 4/8
<b>Turquoise Tanager</b>	Up to 4 at ASA and 5 on the Old Donkey Trail at PAX - 5/4
<b>Bay-headed Tanager</b>	Small numbers at ASA and 1 on the Old Donkey Tail at PAX - 2/5
<b>Trinidad Euphonia</b>	Up to 6 on the road to Mt. St Benedict at PAX - 3/2
<b>Violaceous Euphonia</b>	Small numbers daily at ASA Wright - 3/5
<b>Blue Dacnis</b>	Several at ASA Wright and 3 females and a male at PAX - 4/5
<b>Green Honeycreeper</b>	Up to 9 at the ASA Wright feeders - 4/5
<b>Purple Honeycreeper</b>	Common at ASA Wright and up to 2 at PAX - 5/8
<b>Red-legged Honeycreeper</b>	1 female at ASA and up to 10 on the Main Ridge in Tobago - 6/2
<b>Bicolored Conebill</b>	2 in the Caroni Swamp Bird Sanctuary - 2/1
<b>Swallow Tanager</b>	3 seen briefly on the Northern Range - 3/1
<b>Blue-black Grassquit</b>	Common at Aripo Livestock Farm and Nariva Swamp; small numbers at ASA, Bon Accord and at Blue Waters - 6/9
<b>Black-faced Grassquit</b>	1 juvenile male at Grafton Estate - 1/1
<b>Saffron Finch</b>	A family of 5 at Point-a-Pierre Wildfowl Trust - 5/1
<b>Grayish Saltator</b>	Several at the ASA Wright and Pax feeders - 2/6
